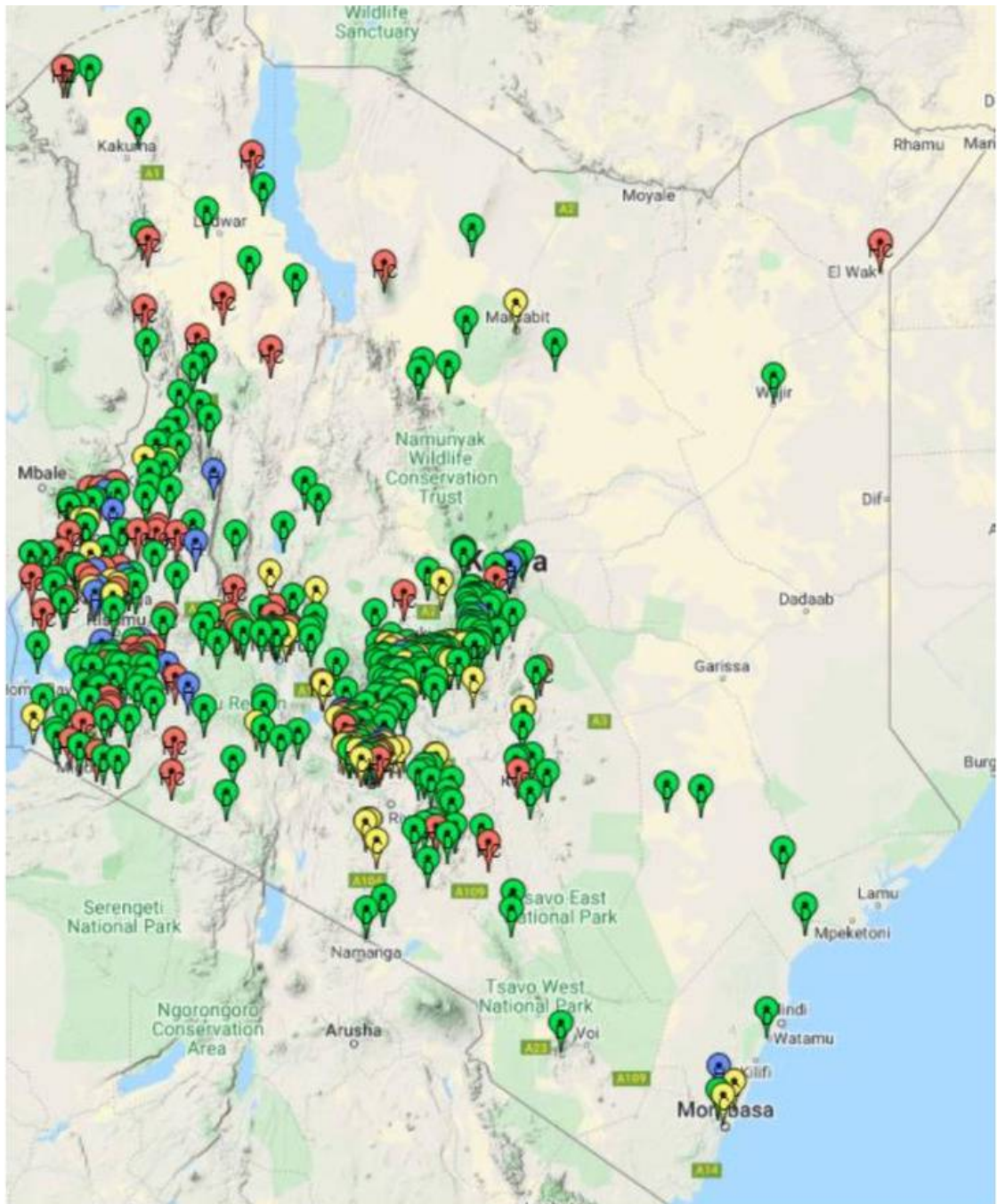
## OUR STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS

# CHAK NETWORK SERVICE DELIVERY SELECTED HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2021

## Maternal and Child Health Services

- All member health facilities engaged in service delivery to women of reproductive age and children.
- Over 25,000 women offered Family Planning services; CHAK is therefore contributing to uptake of modern contraception in Kenya.
- 15,843 women attended first Ante Natal Care (ANC) in CHAK facilities and 12,629 completed at least four ANC visits
- 20,778 women delivered safely in CHAK member health facilities.
- Over 75,000 children accessed immunisation services in the CHAK member network.

## HIV/AIDS services

- 106 CHAK member health units directly supporting HIV/AIDS service delivery across Kenya
- 50,479 HIV/AIDS clients actively on Anti Retroviral Therapy (ART) in CHAK member health units
- Elimination of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV/AIDS services offered to 947 mother and child pairs
- 3,894 key populations served with HIV prevention interventions in the CHAK HIV/AIDS programme.
